# **Office of Grants and Contracts Annual Report**

## Fiscal Year 2010-2011

## **Mission Statement**

The mission of the Office of Grants and Contracts (OGC) at California University of Pennsylvania (Cal U) is to provide support for faculty and staff in the pursuit of external funding and the execution and stewardship of such projects, while ensuring compliance with appropriate University, federal, state and other funding agencies' policies, procedures and regulations.

## Services

The OGC provides assistance in the following areas: identifying potential funding sources; assisting with developing proposals and budgets; facilitating compliance with federal, state, sponsoring agency, and University regulations; completing electronic applications; submitting proposals to sponsoring agencies; negotiating contracts and other award agreements; accepting award documents; and administering post-award non-accounting functions, including subawards, no-cost extensions, and budget revisions.

# **Funding Highlights**

The OGC is pleased to provide the Annual Report for fiscal year 2010-2011. Between July 1, 2010 and June 30, 2011, Cal U received notice that 87 grants/contracts were awarded totaling \$1,800,798. Although the number (71 for FY 2009-2010) of grants and contracts increased 22.5%, the amount of dollars awarded decreased 56.5% compared to the previous fiscal year (\$4,141,446 for FY 2009-2010). The OGC staff worked with faculty and staff to submit 107 proposals totaling \$26,842,125. Compared to the previous fiscal year, this represents an increase of 7.0% in the number of submissions (100 for FY 2009-2010) and an increase of 278.2% in dollars (\$7,096,616 for FY 2009-2010) requested. Throughout the fiscal year, the OGC staff supported faculty and staff as they conducted 82 externally funded projects totaling \$3,547,181. This represents an increase of 30.2% in the number (63 for FY 2009-2010) of grants/contracts and an increase of 8.9% in dollars (\$3,256,658 for FY 2009-2010) compared to the previous fiscal year.

Grants and contracts at the University is a reflection of the commitment that faculty and staff have to their teaching, research and service. We congratulate the 86 faculty and staff who participated in writing grant proposals and administering grant funded projects. Of these participants, we applaud the 22 individuals who served as first time project directors or co-project directors.

Grant proposals covering a wide spectrum of topics and dollar amounts were submitted to a variety of funding sources during the fiscal year. The following are a sampling of the projects developed by Cal U faculty and staff:

- *MEIBL: Using Mobility to Enable Inquiry-Based Learning in STEM Programs* (\$51,585 <sub>for 1 year</sub>), EDUCAUSE through Abilene Christian University
- Dual 7-12 Content and Special Education Baccalaureate Program Planning Grant 2011 (\$20,000 for 6 months), PA Department of Education
- *Community Fellows College Access Corps 2011-2012* (\$18,120 for 1 year), PA Campus Compact via Corporation for National Service
- Biomonitoring and Assessment of Streambank Fencing Sites 2011-2012 (\$17,283 for <sub>6</sub> <sub>months</sub>), CONSOL Energy
- *Creating a Model Chemotherapy Resistance in Small Cell Lung Cancer* (\$5,618 for 1 year), PA State System of Higher Education

External funding at the University provides financial benefits to the University community. Grants and contracts provided the potential to fund \$1,092,059 in compensation for faculty and staff and \$185,996 in compensation for graduate assistants and student workers. If fully expended, these grants and contracts provided the potential to fund \$93,527 of travel, to purchase \$551,314 of equipment, and to purchase \$128,192 of supplies. The budgets for these grants and contracts included \$272,800 to conduct programming and service at campus events.

During the fiscal year the OGC organized and implemented the fourth annual Grant Writers' Fellowship Program. Five Cal U faculty members and six staff members were provided the opportunity to attend a series of workshops conducted by David G. Bauer, a nationally recognized grant writing consultant. The fellows participated in intensive sessions focusing on the process of writing winning grant proposals. The fellows were trained to implement and use quality circles to improve grant proposals and learned techniques for increasing collaboration and effective team building.

With continued focus of providing services and resources in support of faculty and staff efforts in the pursuit of external funding, the OGC hopes to see an increase in the submission and awards for competitive grant proposals in the coming year.
