## How to Register Computer/Laptop on Campus Network

1. Connect wireless to CalNet, as shown below:

10.If the system puts you into remediation due to virus software being out of date, you will need to update your virus software before you can fully connect to the network.

NOTE: You will still be able to browse Cal U's websites while in Remediation. You can also still visit major anti-virus websites and update your anti-virus in Remediation. If you leave your laptop off for any extended period of time (or at a time when your Anti-Virus updates) Bradford will eventually catch your out of date program and then flag you for Remediation. The Anti-Virus normally attempts to auto-update as soon as the client machine is started, but sometimes this does not happen, therefore it is recommended that you manually update your Anti-Virus as soon as you turn your machine on.
